## 1. The right to life, the preservation of life and the development of the child (Article 6)

### Number of deaths of persons under the age of 18 as a result of traffic and other accidents

The accident register in the Traffic Accident Information System (hereinafter referred to as the “TAIS”) statistically monitors children killed as a result of a traffic accident (i.e. only road traffic accidents) as persons under 15 years of physical age. The TAIS does not record any other types of accidents than road traffic accidents.

The following data show that the number of deaths of children under the age of 15 is relatively stable. These accidents were most often recorded among minor co-passengers, followed by pedestrians and then cyclists, whose number in the years under review did not exceed 1 in the given year.

### Children's homes

The Central Office of Labour, Social Affairs and Family as the founder of children's homes (from 1 July 2011) records as of 31 December 2018 a total of 94 children's homes with a capacity of 4,969 places, which housed 4,495 minor children under 18 years of age and 252 young adults over 18 years of age. The capacity of children's homes has increased by 100 places since 2013 - i.e. approx. by 2%. As the number of children placed in children's homes rises every year, the occupancy level oscillates at 96%.

The average length of stay of a child in an children's home decreased in the period under review, and as of 31 December 2013 the average length of stay was 4.58 years (at the end of 2018 it was 3.72 years).

According to the data given in table No. 3, the structure of employees has been changing quite considerably - the number of pedagogical and other staff in groups has been stabilized, but the number of professional parents decreased slightly (by almost 54 compared to 2013), and the number of direct contact employees has also been increasing.

On the other hand, the number of management and operational staff decreased - (compared to 2013, a decrease of almost 65).

#### Percentage of children reconnected with their parents after placement

The number of children whose care in children's homes was terminated in 2018 was 1,169, which is a minimal decrease of 2% compared to 2013. In the period under review, the number of terminations of care due to the return of children to their original family increased - by 45 children, which means an increase of 8%. Compared to the previous period under review, the number of children leaving children's homes due to reaching the age of majority decreased. The placement of children in various forms of substitute families is declining in the period under review. The number of transfers to another facility has increased. Termination of the provision of care for "other" reasons (especially repatriation, reconnection of an unaccompanied minor with parents, expiry of the period for which the educational measure was imposed, expiry of the interim measure, etc.), where it had an increasing trend since 2013, but it dropped to 56 children in 2018.

In connection with the collection of data on minor asylum seekers, an instruction has now been issued by the Director of the Migration Office of the Ministry of the Interior of the Slovak Republic addressed to all asylum facilities and professional departments of the Migration Office of the Ministry of the Interior of the Slovak Republic concerning the processing and handing over of other necessary data on the mentioned minors. According to that regulation, the following will be recorded separately:

- number of minor asylum seekers, 0-18 y.(nationality, sex, age),
